### BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THIS PROGRAM

The Collision Repair courses are designed for students interested in collision repair as a career choice. The courses utilize the I-car Live Curriculum, which will emphasize skills for entry level jobs, including; safety, basic repair techniques, paint safety, undercoat and topcoat systems, HVLP spray gun technology, estimating, and vehicle detailing. The instructor and program are ASE/NATEF certified.

### SPECIAL FEATURES OF THIS PROGRAM

Guest speakers and field trips are a part of these courses. They include Snap-on Tools, technical and trade schools and various product and tool demonstrations. The field experiences include Washtenaw Community College, Auto-Rama, Henry Ford, and the Ford Rouge plant tour. Students are encouraged to bring in appropriate individual projects with instructor approval. A Custom paint class is also part of this course.
