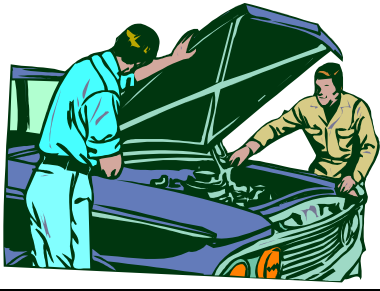

Upon completion of the two year course the students will receive a certificate of completion detailing the skills learned.
