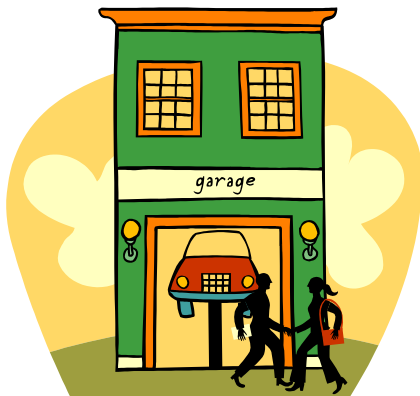
BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THIS PROGRAM

Trenton High School offers Automotive Technology I and II. Each of these classes run two class periods of 73 minutes each. We emphasize hands on completion of the NATEF task areas of Steering and Suspension, and Electrical Systems. We cover aspects of all eight areas of automotive repair over the course of two school years, as most repair areas overlap with each other. We work with both foreign and domestic automotive systems. By the end of the courses the student will be ready for entry level employment in the automotive service field or be ready to enter a post secondary automotive service training program.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF THIS PROGRAM

Each student will learn how to operate each piece of our modern equipment properly and safely. They will be trained by an ASE Master Automobile Technician.
