BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THIS PROGRAM

This course introduces students to Energy Technologies and Renewable Energies by providing the study of basic energy conversion systems. This is an introductory course in heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration. Sheet metal fabrication is also given to each student. Practical laboratory sessions involve copper tubing, test instruments, tools and equipment.
