BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THIS PROGRAM

This program is an exploration of many health careers including nursing, medical doctor, and physical therapist. The program uses the National Health Science Curriculum. Skills learned include infection control practices, safety, Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), first aid, blood pressure, pulse, and respiration monitoring.

In Health II anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, nurse's aide training, and an exposure experience in the field of their choosing are completed.



SPECIAL FEATURES OF THIS PROGRAM

An exam is given at the end of the Health I program for students that have a grade of C or better. If the student passes the exam with a 70% or better they receive a certificate from the National Health Science Consortium. Explorations include job shadowing at Henry Ford Wyandotte Hospital, a visit to a simulation laboratory at Mercy St. Vincent Medical Center Toledo, and to the University of Toledo/Medical College of Ohio Gross Anatomy Laboratory.

At the end of Health II students passing the exam and getting a C in the course can receive the college articulation credit listed above. Also, if the student successfully completes all of the Nurse's Aide curriculum with an 80% or better, they can take the Registry Exam which allows them to work in a medical facility and gains them additional college credit opportunities.

Students are encouraged to participate in HOSA, a student organization for those interested in a Health career.
